



Percentage of households with access to public water supply systems










Households with access to public systems for waste water disposal with adequate treatment






















### Portuguese Companies Doing Business in the World



Activity abroad of the Portuguese companies 53,2 % in Africa







On the average Africa uses less than 4% of water resources this is 5 times less than US or Europe!

Africa has the lowest withdrawal per capita in the world 1/4 of world average, 1/2 of second lowest (South East Asia)

#### Africa loses:

5 % of its GDP because of poor coverage of water supply and sanitation 2 % of its GDP because of power outages

Between 5 % and 25 % because of droughts and floods


Additional 5 % with future impacts of climate change







Percentage of population with improved drinking water source 1990-2008




Only 10 countries equal to or above the world average







Percentage of population with improved sanitation 1990-2008




Only 8 countries equal to or above the world average








#### An enormous lack of infrastructure





Precipitation as a tremendous impact on GDP per capita – lack of infrastructure!

Benefit-cost ratio of investing in water and sanitation – up to 13 in Europe, up to 42 in Africa!
